The anniversary event was open to base residents and employees and featured a performance from the Air Combat Command F-16 Viper Demonstration Team as well guest speakers who have contributed to both the developmental test of the F-16 and also those who have flown the aircraft in combat.

March 3-6: Nellis AFB, Nev. — The new commander and command chief of Air Combat Command toured Nellis Air Force Base March 3-6. Nellis Airmen showcased for Gen. Ken Wilsbach and Chief Master Sqt. David Wolfe their commitment to meeting the demands of Great Power Competition as part of an ongoing effort to address the ever-evolving challenges facing the U.S. Air Force.

March: Edwards AFB, Calif. — A TU-2S Dragon Lady assigned to the 9th Reconnaissance Wing, Beale Air Force Base, Calif., recently returned to service after nearly two years through the collaboration of the Air Force Life Cycle Management Center, 412th Test Wing at Edwards AFB, Calif., and Lockheed Martin Corporation. Due to special circumstances, the decision was made to perform depot level modifications in place at Beale. However, the aircraft was still required to return to its birthplace at OL Plant 42 to receive its iconic black coating. AFLCMC leads the combined government-industry team for both depot operations and new flight test requirements on the U-2 platform. The 412th Test Wing at Edwards provides flight operations oversight and airfield logistics to ensure all ferry and test sorties are executed safely.



LEFT: March 4-17: Edwards AFB, Calif. — An Air Force Research Laboratorydeveloped physiological monitoring system for pilots completed a series of F-16 flight tests March 4-17, 2024, at the U.S. Air Force Test Pilot School, or TPS, at Edwards Air Force Base, California. The 422d Test and Evaluation Squadron also completed flight tests on the system in January and February 2024 at Nellis Air Force Base, Nev. Six TPS student test pilots and engineers used the Integrated Cockpit Sensing, or ICS, system inside the F-16 to collect data for their capstone test management project. The ICS system, developed by AFRL's 711th Human Performance Wing, Human Effectiveness Directorate, fuses sensors that collect physiologic markers from pilots during flight.

LEFT: March 14: Davis-Monthan AFB, Ariz. - The Royal Canadian Air Force conducted Exercise Cougar South at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Ariz., March 14, 2024. The exercise included scenario-based missions, air combat tactics, close air support training, air-toair refueling training, and employment of precision-guided munitions. Davis-Monthan trained the RCAF to uphold its primary mission of deploying, employing and sustaining combat search and rescue, attack airpower in support of combatant commanders anywhere in the world.

April 1: NASA Armstrong – After 37 years of successful airborne science missions, NASA's DC-8 aircraft completed its final mission and returned to the agency's Armstrong Flight Research Center Building 703 in Palmdale, Calif. The DC-8 and crew were welcomed back with a celebratory water salute by the U.S Air Force Plant 42 Fire Department after completing an air quality study, the Airborne and Satellite Investigation of Asian Air Quality, or ASIA-AQ mission. The aircraft is set to retire after concluding operations in May.

April: Edwards AFB, Calif. — The U.S. Air Force Test Pilot School and the Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency were finalists for the 2023 Robert J. Collier Trophy, a formal acknowledgement of recent breakthroughs that have launched the machine-learning era within the aerospace industry. The teams worked together to test breakthrough executions in artificial intelligence algorithms using the X-62A VISTA aircraft as part of DARPA's Air Combat Evolution (ACE) program.

May 6: Davis-Monthan AFB, Ariz. — An HH-60G Pave Hawk helicopter, tail number A6224, maintained by U.S. Air Force Tech Sgt. Anthony Staley, 943rd Maintenance Squadron crew chief, and Senior Airman Harley Straps, 943rd MXS assistant crew chief, achieved a "black letter status" before its retirement at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Ariz. "A 'black lettered' aircraft indicates that there is nothing wrong with it," said Capt. Anthony Laporta, 943rd MXS director of operations. "I personally have been in the Air Force 19 years and have only seen it one other time. Most of these models have always carried a discrepancy."

May 20: Edwards AFB, Calif. — In another historic first, students of the Space Test Course at the U.S. Air Force Test Pilot School successfully operated a satellite in space from Edwards Air Force Base, Calif., May 20. Previous classes have coordinated with commercial space providers to acquire satellite imagery to support multi-domain testing, dictating desired imagery and pass schedules, albeit without direct interaction with the satellite. May 20 marks the inaugural instance where U.S. Space Force STC Class 24A students issued commands to a satellite on orbit from Edwards thanks to a partnership with the Air Force Research Laboratory's Space Vehicle Directorate.

> May 28: Edwards AFB, Calif. — Following its formal unveiling, Dec. 2, 2022, the B-21 Raider began flight testing at Edwards where it continues to make progress toward becoming the backbone of the U.S. Air Force bomber fleet. On May 8, 2024, during testimony at the Senate Armed Services committee, Andrew Hunter, Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Acquisition, Technology and Logistics, highlighted B-21 flight testing is on track to meet timelines and deliver to the warfighter. "We are in the flight test program, the flight test program is proceeding well," said Hunter in response to a question about the B-21 program. "It is doing what flight test programs are designed to do, which is helping us learn about the unique characteristics of this platform, but in a very, very effective way."

LEFT: July 18: Edwards AFB, Calif. — A trio of A-29 Super Tucano aircraft arrived at Edwards Air Force Base, Calif., to join a unique fleet at the Air Force Test Pilot School. The arrival marks the first newly assigned aircraft for the school in nearly 30 years. The A-29 was designed as a low-cost, close-air support aircraft. These A-29s were originally acquired by Air Force Special Operations Command but divested after mission requirements changed. The Air Force Test Center and school leadership saw these excess aircraft as a unique opportunity to expand the flight test and training capabilities at Edwards.

August



LEFT: August: Edwards AFB, Calif. — The 412th Test Wing tested a new weapons pylon that could remove traditional weapon constraints. Known as the Load Adaptable Modular Pylon, the equipment recently flew attached to a B-1B test aircraft with the 419th Flight Test Squadron. Designed by Boeing and referred to as the LAM, the unique pylon is designed to carry a variety of standard and emerging weapons with seamless transition, allowing for maximum agility while also strengthening weapon test infrastructure. While the B-1B was chosen due to aircraft availability at Edwards, the LAM can be modified for attachment to a variety of other aircraft if the need were to arise.





Oct. 15: Edwards AFB, Calif. — In a big win for U.S. Air Force readiness, the "Spirit of Nebraska" a B-2 bomber, returned to operations 91 days ahead of schedule, after completing programmed depot maintenance (PDM) here on Oct. 15, 2024. Previously, it has taken B-2s approximately 470 days to go through PDM. However, the "Spirit of Nebraska" was able to get through PDM in only 379 days due to several changes the Air Force Life Cycle Management Center's Bombers Directorate made to improve efficiency.

LEFT: Sept. 13: Davis-Monthan AFB, Ariz. — The 355th Wing's 354th Fighter Squadron and 354th Fighter Generation Squadron inactivated at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Sept. 13, 2024. Known as the Bulldogs, the squadrons conducted 35,000 combat sorties, where they fired more than a quarter million 30 mm rounds, supported 1,300 troops in contact, flew missions against numerous highvalue targets and provided close air support in 71 successful rescues. The first A-10 Thunderbolt II aircraft arrived at DM in 1976. With the inactivation and the U.S. Air Force's divestment plan, the two squadrons have retired and transferred all 36 of their A-10s.

Oct. 22: NASA Armstrong - The latest iteration of an atmospheric probe developed by researchers at NASA's Armstrong Flight Research Center at Edwards, Calif., successfully completed a test flight. Building on NASA 1960s research on lifting body aircraft, which use the aircraft's shape for lift instead of wings, the concept could offer future scientists a potentially better and more economical way to collect data on other planets. Testing demonstrated the shape of the probe works.

Right; Oct. 31: NASA — A model of the X-66 aircraft with a wingspan of almost six feet was placed in the 12-Foot Low-Speed Wind Tunnel at NASA's Langley Research Center in Hampton, Va. During the tests, the team captured measurements of forces such as lift and drag over many aerodynamic configurations and flight conditions. At NASA, each project has milestones to ensure everything stays on track. The agency's Sustainable Flight Demonstrator (SFD) project recently passed through one of these markers of

progress, as it completed a key phase of wind tunnel tests using a model of the X-66. The X-66 is an experimental aircraft that aims to achieve more sustainable flight primarily through its wing design. Known as a transonic truss-braced wing, the concept combines extra-long wings stabilized with diagonal struts; a design that could result in a more fuel-efficient airliner. But before a full-size demonstrator version of the X-66 can fly, its team will need to perform tests involving several smaller models of the aircraft.



Nov. 1: Davis-Monthan AFB, Ariz. — Maj. Lindsay "MAD" Johnson, A-10C Thunderbolt II Demonstration Team commander and pilot, flies in formation with a P-51 Mustang during the final local A-10 demonstration and Heritage Flight at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Arizona, Nov. 1, 2024. The Airman in the back seat of the P-51 was Senior Airman Ben Everse, A-10 Demo Team crew chief, who received an incentive flight for his hard work on the demo team throughout the 2024 season.



Nov. 13: Nellis AFB, Nev. — The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency recently announced the identification of the remains of three World War II members of the 17th Pursuit Squadron, currently the 57th Wing's 17th Weapons Squadron. U.S. Army Air Force Pvt. Bernard J. Curran of Lowell, Mass., Pfc. Bernard J. Calvi of North Adams, Mass., and Sgt James W. Swartz of Webberville, Mich. served with the squadron's ground echelon. The air echelon operated the P-40 Warhawk aircraft, flying missions in the Philippine Islands.

In December 1941, Japanese forces invaded the islands. The ground echelon, pressed into service as an infantry, taking part in intense fighting on the Bataan peninsula. They surrendered on April 9, 1942, and Curran, Calvi, and Swartz were among the thousands captured. After surviving the 65-mile Bataan Death March, they were placed in the notorious Cabanatuan POW camp. Conditions at the camp were inadequate, including deficient food and water which ended up leading to malnutrition and outbreaks of malaria and dysentery. With More than 2,500 perished at the camp during the war, including Calvi, age 23, on July 16, 1942, Swartz, age 21, on Sept. 23, 1942, and Curran, age 20, on Nov. 24, 1942. They were buried with other deceased prisoners in the local Cabanatuan Camp Cemetery in common graves.

Dec. 3-9: Edwards AFB, Calif. — The 412th Test Wing conducted the largest combat readiness exercise in Air Force Materiel Command corporate memory Dec. 3 to 6, and followed up with a full-day community partner tabletop readiness exercise on Dec. 9 at Edwards. The exercise and associated inspection tested Edwards' and Plant 42's response to a range of simulated security threats and operational challenges in this age of great power competition. Events began with a mid-morning alert to base leadership simulating an increase in the threat level to the base, prompting the exercise to elevate to Force Protection Condition Charlie. This was followed by a simulated explosion at the base's west gate, escalating the situation to FPCON Delta within the exercise space — indicating a heightened risk of ongoing or complex attacks on base people, facilities and assets.

Dec. 12: NASA Armstrong — NASA completed the first maximum afterburner engine run test on its X-59 quiet supersonic research aircraft on Dec. 12. The ground test, conducted at Lockheed Martin's Skunk Works facility in Palmdale, Calif., marks a significant milestone as the X-59 team progresses toward flight. An afterburner is a component of some jet engines that generates additional thrust. Running the engine, an F414-GE-100, with afterburner will allow the X-59 to meet its supersonic speed requirements. The test demonstrated the engine's ability to operate within temperature limits and with adequate airflow for flight. It also showed the engine's ability to operate in sync with the aircraft's other subsystems.



Dec. 7: Edwards AFB, Calif. — The USAF Test Pilot School achieved another historic milestone, Dec.7, 2024, graduating the first yearlong, fully integrated flight and space test course. The Air Force Test Center established a three-month Space Test Course at TPS in 2019, prior to the inception of the U.S. Space Force, to address a pressing need for a highly talented, formally educated cadre of testers in the space domain. Almost immediately after its inception, then-Vice Chief of Staff of the Air Force Gen. David Allvin and Vice Chief of Space Operations Gen. David Thompson requested a year-long Space Test Course to match TPS's storied Flight Test Course.




